Duration.	8 Month Fellowship (32 weeks): Starting July 2024 through February 2025 (dates are dependent upon the start date).
Location.	Remote, the position is assigned to the Washington Office, National Recruitment team, Deputy Chief for Business Operations

Job Overview

INTRODUCTION

The position is located at a Forest Service unit with responsibility for supporting managers and resource specialists in the use of geospatial technology and Geographic Information Systems (GIS) for land, natural resources and ecosystem management.

MAJOR DUTIES

DATA MANAGEMENT

Works with managers and resource specialists to determine type, amount and level of information required to develop and analyze ecosystem management alternatives. Assists with developing data dictionaries, data models, and metadata for multi-disciplinary information and geospatial applications. Converts geospatial information and remote sensing imagery into GIS databases. Assists with the organization and maintenance of resource information and data to facilitate analysis across multiple disciplines including but not limited to recreation, silviculture, planning, engineering, and fire.

Manages the Career Map on the Forest Service external website, which is an interactive tool for job seekers, both inside and outside of the agency. This tool gives potential applicants the ability to looks for careers in the locations they desire, in the field and level that is right for them.

The Career Map was developed using ArcGIS Experience Builder, the primary component of this tool is the map of all open opportunities, with accompanying filters, lists, and details of positions. The opportunities on this map come from two databases: USAJobs and the Forest Service Outreach Database.



USAJobs provides all currently open opportunities in the Forest Service, and this data is pulled using the USAJobs application programming interface (API). The Outreach Database provides positions that are advertised or are available to candidates on an open and continuous recruitment (OCR) announcement. These datasets are refreshed every weekday.

The Career Map includes filters for opening type, State, job series, job category, GS (General Schedule) level, remote status, position term, and hiring path. Each of these filters allow job seekers to narrow down the positions they may be interested in. Users can also search for job title, series, category, or city in the middle column below the map to further narrow their search. The tool is dynamic, so when a job is selected from the list or from the map, the details pop up on the right pane below the map and on the map itself. Within the details of each position on the map are links to learn more. For an open position, the link takes users to the USAJobs page where they can apply; for an outreach position, the link downloads the position's outreach notice.

GEOSPATIAL ANALYSIS
