Job Overview

This North Zone position is critical to the maintenance of developed recreation sites including those along the Wild and Scenic Salmon River Corridor, Twin Creek and Meadow Lake Campground complexes, boat launches, and trail heads supporting Wilderness access and Central Idaho Priority Areas. This position is responsible for implementing Great American Outdoors Act work, collaborating with partners, facility and visitor use surveys, water system testing, cleaning and upkeep of sites, and data entry. Additional duties of this position include participating in educational activities and operating and maintaining all vehicles and tools associated with duties of the position.

Responsibilities and Duties

- Support the North Zone Developed Recreation Program
- Support Partner Organizations
- Assist in the Implementation of Great American Outdoors Act projects.
- Participate in Outdoor and Environmental Education programs.
