AN OVERVIEW OF MANRRS HISTORY

In the early 1980s, a concerned minority student, Dave Weatherspoon, recognized the need for a support group for minority students in agricultural programs at Michigan State University (MSU). With the help and guidance of a sensitive college advisor, Eunice Foster, he set out to form such a group on his campus. From these efforts, the Minority Agriculture and Natural Resources Association (MANRA), a registered student organization in the College of Agriculture at MSU, was founded in the spring of 1982. News of MANRA reached a staff person whose responsibilities included promoting participation of minority students in agricultural sciences at The Pennsylvania State University (PSU). In 1985, after a series of communications between institutions, representatives of MANRA and their faculty mentor visited PSU to help form an organization for minority students in its College of Agriculture. Out of this meeting, Minorities in Agriculture (MIA) was formed by the Penn State group. Dr. William Henson served as the first advisor for this group at Penn State.

In April 1986, MANRA and MIA jointly sponsored "The First Annual Conference of Minority Students in Agriculture and Natural Resources" at MSU. A primary focus of the conference was the problem of how to organize student disciplinary interest groups on university campuses. Over 40 students and faculty from six colleges participated. The second conference, also sponsored jointly by MANRA and MIA, was held, April 1987, at PSU. More than 60 people from 11 colleges, six government organizations, and five private organizations participated. The third conference was held at the University of Maryland Eastern Shore, April 1988. This was a pivotal meeting for the formation of MANRRS. Student and faculty representatives from all 1862 and 1890 land grant colleges and universities, including Tuskegee University, were invited. Representatives from interested public and private agencies were also invited to participate.



The Nomination Package must include:

- Completed nomination form and cover sheet.
- Nominee's 1-2 page resume.
- Two (2) letters of recommendation from past or present mentees of the nominee. Letters should describe the positive impact the nominee had on the mentee.
- One to two (1-2) page summary detailing the impact the nominee has had on the chapter growth, leadership, professional, and career training of past and present MANRRS members and why the nominee is deserving of the award.

NOTE: The MANRRS Advisor must have served in this position for at least two years. The Nominator and the two other persons writing the letters of reference must be current or past MANRRS members. Self-nominations and nominations for members, posthumously, will not be accepted. The Nominator, the primary, and secondary mentees must be three different individuals.



WILLIAM HENSON MANRRS LEGEND AWARD

- Individual should be an active member of MANRRS.
- Professional member of the organization for a minimum of 15 years.
- Participated on at least one MANRRS committee in the last five years.

Guidelines

- The individual cannot nominate themselves to receive the award.
- The nominating person should write a onepage essay on why the person should receive the award and include the individual's accomplishments within the National Society.
- The individual will be chosen by the Executive Committee via majority vote.
- This information must be submitted to the MANRRS National Office via the MANRRS website.

Recognition

The individual will be highlighted in the Final Conference Program with a one-page layout that includes a color photo, brief biography and a list of MANRRS Accomplishments.

The individual will be formally recognized at the Gala Dinner on Saturday evening, March 23rd, with an award as well as provide brief remarks to the attendees.





Author • ESPN Analyst • 9-year NFL veteran • Founder of Athletes for Justice • Ambassador for International Justice Mission • Director of Human Capital, Innovation and Impact at AWM Capital

Sam Acho is an author, a public speaker, a humanitarian, an in-studio analyst for ESPN, a nine-year NFL veteran and a committed Christian. He's also currently an ambassador for the International Justice Mission.

Sam was recently inducted into the University of Texas Athletics Hall of Honor, having played college football at the University of Texas at Austin, where he received the William V. Campbell Trophy for being college football's top scholar-athlete. He also won

the NCAA Top VIII Award, which recognizes the top eight student-athletes in all of sports, and was named the 2010 Big 12 Sportsperson of the Year. In 2011, Sam was drafted by the Arizona Cardinals and played four seasons as a linebacker with the team. He then signed with the Chicago Bears for the 2015–2016 season and played four years there before spending the 2019 season with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

In 2016 and 2017, Sam was the Bears' nominee for the Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year Award, the league's only award that recognizes both civic and professional contributions. Sam served on the leadership committee for both the Cardinals and the Bears. He was also vice president of the NFL Players Association, an organization in which he served since his second year in the NFL.

Having grown up in Dallas with parents who emphasized scholastic achievement, Sam was named by Sporting News as one of the twenty smartest athletes in all of sports. He received his MBA in 2015 at Thunderbird School of Global Management, the #1 ranked international MBA program in the world. Sam is the founder and president of Athletes for Justice, an organization that works to unite professional athletes and everyday athletes to fight injustices around the world. He has been featured in Super Bowl commercials highlighting his social justice efforts in the city of Chicago.

Sam's first book, Let the World See You: How to Be Real in a World Full of Fakes, was released in October 2020. In it, he shares lessons from his own life as well as stories from others to reveal how you can overcome your fears and discover your true selves. His second book, Change Starts With You: Following Your Fire to Heal a Broken World, was released in March 2023.
